Message from the President Tim Keyes Chapter Activity at the National Level

Our chapter's current president, Tim Keyes, is also an active member of the Committee on Applied Statisticians at the national level. This group has recently been revitalized with a new leader, Dr. Mani Lakshminarayanan of Centor, Inc., and charged with reaching out to underserved individuals who apply statistics in their chosen profession.

The committee is currently seeking funding from the Strategic Initiatives budget to:

Increase participation by focusing on activities relevant to applied statisticians at collaborative workshops (e.g. ASA representation at SUGI conferences, including sponsoring sessions or workshops).

Explore using membership information from other organizations (e.g., mailing lists) for survey

purposes, to increase awareness among those individuals who are not currently members of the ASA, or do not take advantage of its' offerings.
