## Executive Member Bios

**Rachel Caspar**, SRMS Education Officer, is a Senior Survey Methodologist at RTI International. Prior to joining RTI International she received her Master's in applied social research from the University of Michigan. Her research interests include design of questionnaires and data collection procedures for surveys of sensitive topics, questionnaire evaluation and testing, and designing culturally and linguistically appropriate survey materials. She also teaches questionnaire design through the Joint Program in Survey Methodology and The University of Michigan's Summer Institute in Survey Research Techniques.

**David R. Judkins**, SRMS Program Chair Elect, is a senior statistician at Westat. His work for several years has primarily focused on using samples with complex sample designs to evaluate social interventions, with everything that entails from sample and instrument design through weighting, editing, and imputation, to propensity scoring and variance estimation. Other interesting work has included preparing sample design options for the proposed National Children's Study and for energy surveys. He joined Westat in 1986 after seven formative years at the Census Bureau and rejoined Westat in 1997 after a brief but exciting foray to RTI in 1996. He received a master's degree in mathematics from Indiana University in 1979.

**Virginia M. Lesser**, SRMS Treasurer-Elect, is Director of the Survey Research Center and Assoc. Prof. in the Department of Statistics at Oregon State University. His primary research interests are time series and seasonal adjustment. His work has led to the introduction of intervention analysis and concurrent adjustment in seasonal adjustment at BLS. He currently serves on ASA's Scientific and Public Affairs Committee. He has been an Associate Editor of *Journal of Official Statistics*, program chair for ASA's section on Business and Economic Statistics, and methodology chair for the Washington Statistical Society. He received a Ph.D. in Mathematics (Statistics) from the Catholic University of America in 1972.

**Roger Tourangeau**, SRMS Chair-Elect, is Director of the Joint Program in Survey Methodology at the University of Maryland and Research Prof. in the Institute for Social Research at the University of Michigan. His main research interest is measurement error in surveys, but he has also done work on coverage error and sample design. He is the lead author of a book on cognitive aspects of survey methodology (with Lance Rips and Kenneth Rasinski, *The Psychology of Survey Response*, Cambridge University Press, 2000) and is one of several authors of a new text on survey methods (*Survey Methodology*, Wiley, 2004). He has a Ph.D. in Psychology from Yale University. He was elected ASA Fellow in 1999.
